






PAST & CURRENT COOPERATION



TERM-KE

- TERM-KE shared all lethality data with C-KEM
 - Discarding Rocket Motors
 - Terminal Effects
- PM-KEM contributed (\$100K of \$250K) joint armor test

TERM/MRM

- AMCOM Access to All TERM/MRM Designs and Performance data
- PM-Common Missile (CM) personnel have contributed at major meetings
- AMCOM supported TERM APS Analysis
- AMCOM conducted the TERM CFT
- PM-CM allowed to use TERM equipment for their Captive Flight Test
- AMCOM is supporting digital simulation of MRM
- CKEM SCG used as a reference for MRM SCG
- MRM is laying ground work for HIL/SIL at AMCOM
