# UFGS: WHY

- IN THE BEGINNING – DoD Created The Military Services
- FREEDOM – Services were Independent, Competitive, Happy
- DoD WARNING – Avoid Duplication of Effort; Have Similar Facilities & Quality
- COORDINATION – Improved but Limited
- UNIFICATION – Weak Attempts

# UFGS: PREVIOUS ATTEMPTS

- **Standard Specifications** (USACE - “H”Piles, Earthwork – 1950s)
- **FCGS** (Several Gov’t Agencies, 150 developed – 1960s - 1970s)
- **MCGS** (Tri-Service implementation of FCGS – 50 developed – 1970s)
- **Coordination** on various sections and goals (1980s -1990s)

# UFGS: MANDATE

- **House Conference Report 105-247**, 9 Sept 97, directed uniform criteria and guide specifications for military services.
- **Tri-Service Report** to Congressional Committee, March 1998
- **UFGS Master published**, March 2001
- **Under Secretary of Defense Memorandum**, signed by E.C. Aldridge, Jr., 29 May 02, directed the UFGS be used for DoD facilities regardless of funding source.

# UFGS: OBJECTIVES

## (Tri-Service Report)

- Common Criteria
- Common Database
- Uniformity of Presentation
- Coordinated Content
- Save on preparation and maintenance costs
- MAINTAIN TECHNICAL EXPERTISE IN EACH SERVICE

# UFGS: PURPOSE

(Tri-Service Report)

- Specify Government requirements
- Utilize industry standards
- Promote Full and open competition
- Sound basis for contract documents
- Reduce errors and omissions

# UFGS: UNIFORMITY

## (Tri-Service Report)

- CSI MasterFormat section numbering
- CSI Three-Part Section format
- Consistent paragraph sequence and format
- Uniform notes to the designer
  - \* Uniform paragraph format
  - \* Consistent paragraph sequence
  - \* Uniform designer notes format

# UFGS: AUTOMATION (SpecsIntact)

## (Tri-Service Report)

- Automatic Reference Paragraph Generation
- Reference Lists and Reports
- Submittal Register / Submittal Reports
- English / Metric Measurement Units
- Link to Criteria Change Request (CCR) Form
- Publish in SEC, DOC, or PDF Formats
- Job Processing



# UFGS: SYSTEM

- Established in MIL-STD-3007
- Covers Both UFC and UFGS Documents
  - Management structure
  - Procedures for programming
  - Procedures for development
  - Procedures for maintenance

# UFGS: OVERSITE / MANAGEMENT

- ENGINEERING SENIOR EXECUTIVE PANEL (ESEP)
- COORDINATING PANEL (CP)
- DISCIPLINE WORKING GROUPS (DWG)
- GUIDE SPECIFICATIONS WORKING GROUP (GSWG)

# UFGS: ENGINEERING SENIOR EXECUTIVE PANEL

- Members: ODUSD Representative and Tri-Service Chiefs of Engineering
- Establish policy, resource proponent, resolve issues, oversee Coordinating Panel
- Oversee all unified criteria documents

# UFGS: COORDINATING PANEL

- Engineering Managers
- Represent Army, Navy, Air Force, DoD
- Manage all unified criteria
- Recommend Program Composition
- Formally approve UFC documents

# UFGS: DISCIPLINE WORKING GROUPS

- Members are Technical Proponents (Discipline Experts)
- Represent Participating Agencies
- Responsible for unified criteria documents within their discipline
- Recommend program composition

# UFGS: GUIDE SPECIFICATIONS WORKING GROUP

- Members are specifications experts
- Recommend policy/procedures for UFGS
- Represent Participating Agencies
- Establish UFGS format

# UFGS: DATABASE

- Each Preparing Activity (PA) maintains their own database
- One PA serves as UFGS Database Manager on a rotating basis
- Database Manager combines individual databases into UFGS database and processes for publication on the internet

# UFGS: THE COUNT

- **March 2001: 800 + Sections**
  - 450 +or- sections carried “A” or “N” designation
  - Combining similar sections should reduce total to approximately 575
- **July 2005: 699 Sections**
  - 120 “A” sections; 129 “N” sections
  - Combining similar sections should reduce total to approximately 575
- **In over 4.5 years we have combined approximately 200 sections, reducing total number of sections by about 100**
- **Original target was to eliminate “A” and “N” within 5 years**



# UFGS: THE CHALLENGE

- **Convert to MF04 Section Number**
- **Automate section references**
- **Link references to actual documents**
- **Refine Review and Approval process**
- **Accommodate other Agencies**

# UFGS: MF04 SECTION NUMBERS

- Proposed numbers developed
  - Based on limiting UFGS number to 3<sup>rd</sup> level
  - Review by Discipline Working Groups
  - Include proposed number in UFGS banners
  - Use updated SpecsIntact software
  - Change UFGS number and file name

# UFGS: AUTOMATE SECTION REFERENCES

- Form now is Section 00000 TITLE
- Form will be Section 00 00 00 TITLE
- Need program to automate the operation and to adjust in the future

Section <SRF>00 00 00</SRF> TITLE

# UFGS: LINK TO REFERENCED DOCUMENTS

- 90% of references in UFGS available online
- Hyperlinks in UFGS could link to actual document
- UMRL could be the controlling list
- Actively pursuing this possibility

# UFGS: REVIEW AND APPROVAL PROCESS

- Each new and revised UFGS must be coordinated with other agencies
- Often misunderstanding regarding approval
- Need method to document the process without delaying the process or burdening the people involved

# UFGS: OTHER AGENCIES

- UFGS program participation open to other agencies
- Other agencies must follow MIL-STD-3007
- NASA has signed MOU to participate; VA considering participation
- Other agencies could follow
