Benefits

- Eliminates duplication of effort
- Reduces Costs
- Reduces Log Footprint
- Enhances support
- Improves response time
- Commonality of equipment and processes
- Standardization of approach

Joint Theater Logistics strengthens unity of effort



Challenges

- Lack of equipment commonality
- Lack of common logistics processes
- Lack of common logistics IT system
- Unique Services' responsibilities (Title 10) culture
 - Control vs collaboration and trust
- Numerous Joint Log Forums/Initiatives
- Joint Logistics is Theater Centric
 - Services should leverage each other's logistics capabilities
 - Ensuring Air and Maritime domain is incorporated into joint log constructs



Opportunities

- Increased engagement with Maritime Partners
 - Integration of logistics between USMC and USN
 - Ongoing effort / significant benefits achieved
 - Integration of logistics between USN and USCG
 - Recent initiative
- Increased engagement of Navy ground forces
 - With other Services operating in the Land Domain
 - USMC, USA and USAF
