CMMI for Small Organizations

- » Myths: CMMI won't work for small organizations, it is too expensive and time consuming
- Truth: CMMI will work, it is just important to:
 - » #1 be creative with project selection
 - » #2 plan timelines carefully and prepare for the worst
 - » #3 don't go overboard with project selection consider use of resources

- »Representative of the organization











Finding Full Life-Cycle Projects

» Challenge #1: Identifying multiple full life-cycle projects for complete process coverage
















☐ Project #1

Finding Full Life-Cycle Projects

» Example: Team had identified two complete full life-cycle projects, but there were some missing phases











Making the Schedule

- » Challenge #2: Schedule / Budget
 - » Gap Analysis
 - » Mapping Practice Implementation Indicators
 - » Project selection
 - : Is the project far enough along
 - : Contingencies
 - » Resources











Making the Schedule

» Examples:

- » Project put on hold, scrambled to get another project far enough along to complete for appraisal
- » Appraiser availability cuts into timeline

Representative Projects

» Challenge #3: Projects must be representative of organization









Representative Projects

» Example: Most of an organization's projects include verification and have more than 10 engineers, but no comparable full life-cycle projects were available











Summary

- » Key to small organization success is careful project selection:
 - »Be creative
 - » Plan timelines carefully
 - »Book in advance
 - » Have a backup, or two
 - »Select representative projects
 - »But, don't go overboard!
