Engines are to GE as Biometrics are to DOJ/DHS



Importance of NGI

- Potential to serve <u>many</u> USG needs
 - Validating a negative, as important as proving a positive
- CJIS history of service, ability to support long term
 - Universities (WV & Pitt) and Private Sector
 - DOD presence and planned growth
- Procurement designed for the long-term
 - Inclusive procurement but unimpressive showing by other agencies
- <u>CJIS Advisory Policy Board (APB) support</u>





Technology not the driving issue We've figured it out (mostly) – UCORE, NIEM, MIEM and TWPDES

Challenges with US Visit

- Segmentation issue
 - Criminal information in IAFIS
 - Criminal and Civil Information in IDENT
- MOUs with others
 - Impacting FBI and FBI customers without realizing the potential damage
 - Not following Guideline 4
- Without Exit pushing more work on FBI systems
- Keeping data up to date, especially expunged records – (2 systems vs. 1 system)
 - Audits are slow and expensive

Concluding Thoughts

- Can't separate biometrics from other sharing efforts
- Can't fund biometrics separately
- Standards are good....and needed
- It's a complex issue that requires policy makers to pay attention as it touches:
 - Access
 - Privacy
 - Safety of the Homeland
