

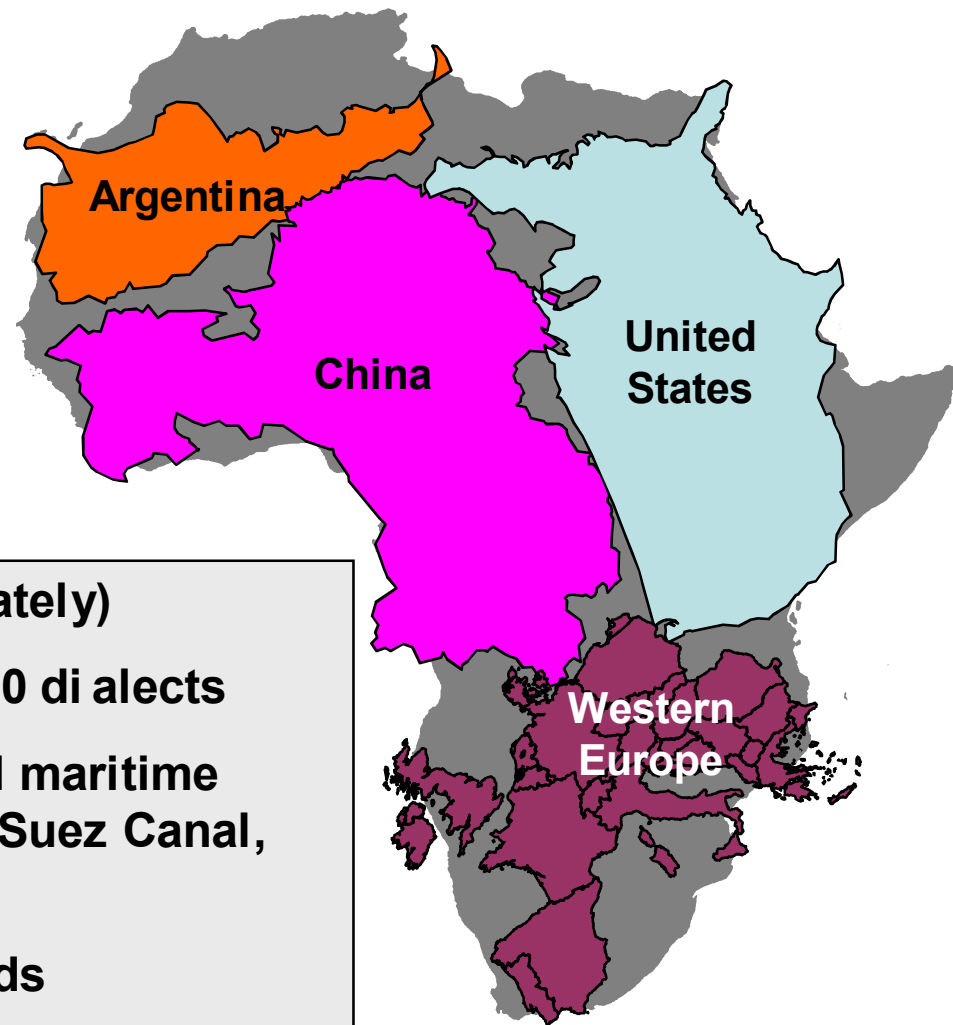

An Understanding of Africa



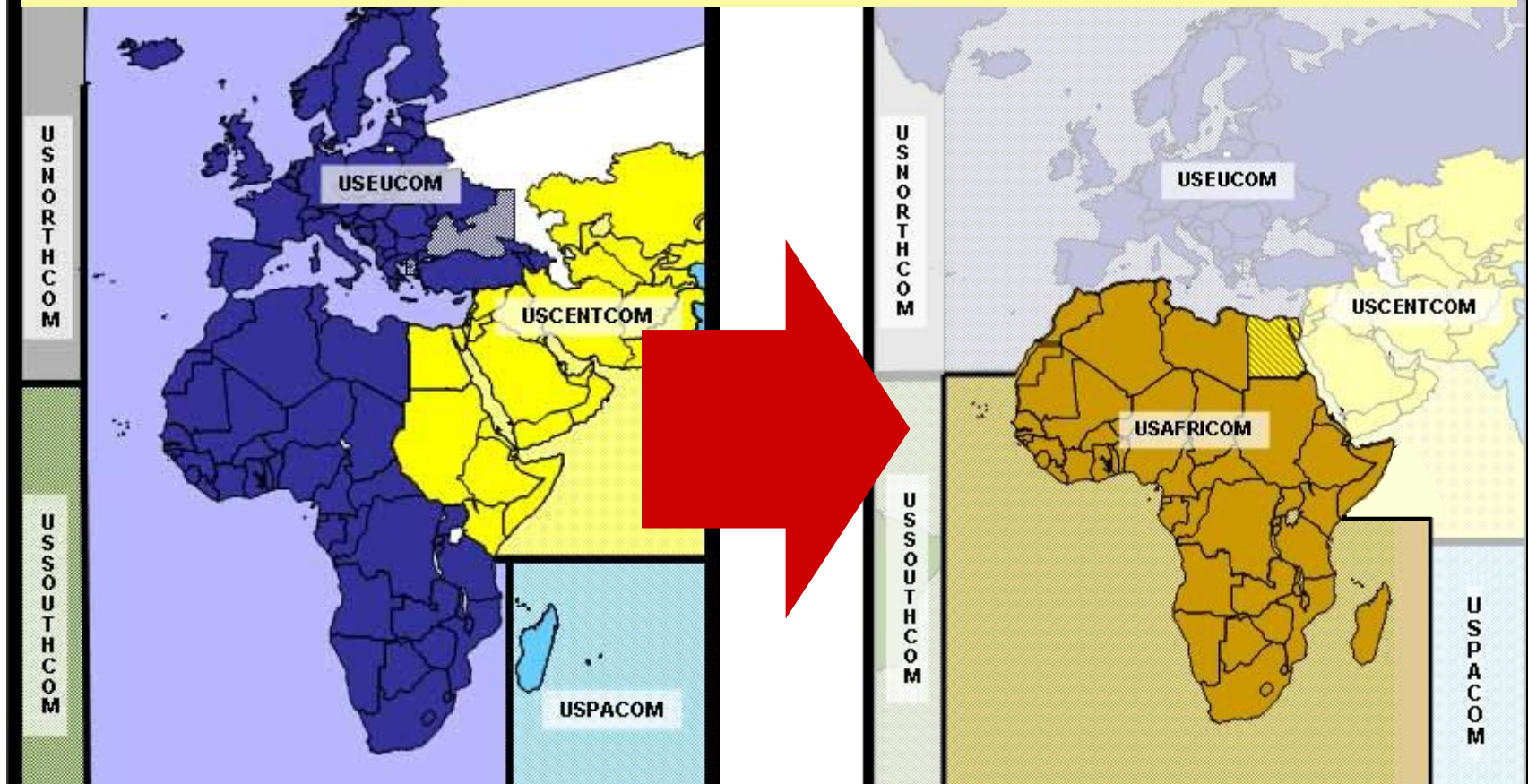
AFRICA:

- “ Population: 1 billion (approximately)
- “ Over 800 ethnic groups and 1000 dialects
- “ Geographic proximity to critical maritime chokepoints (Straits of Gibraltar, Suez Canal, Bab al Mandab)
- “ Meets 20% of US oil import needs
- “ 2009 supplied 4.7% of US natural gas imports

Consolidates the continent under one unified command

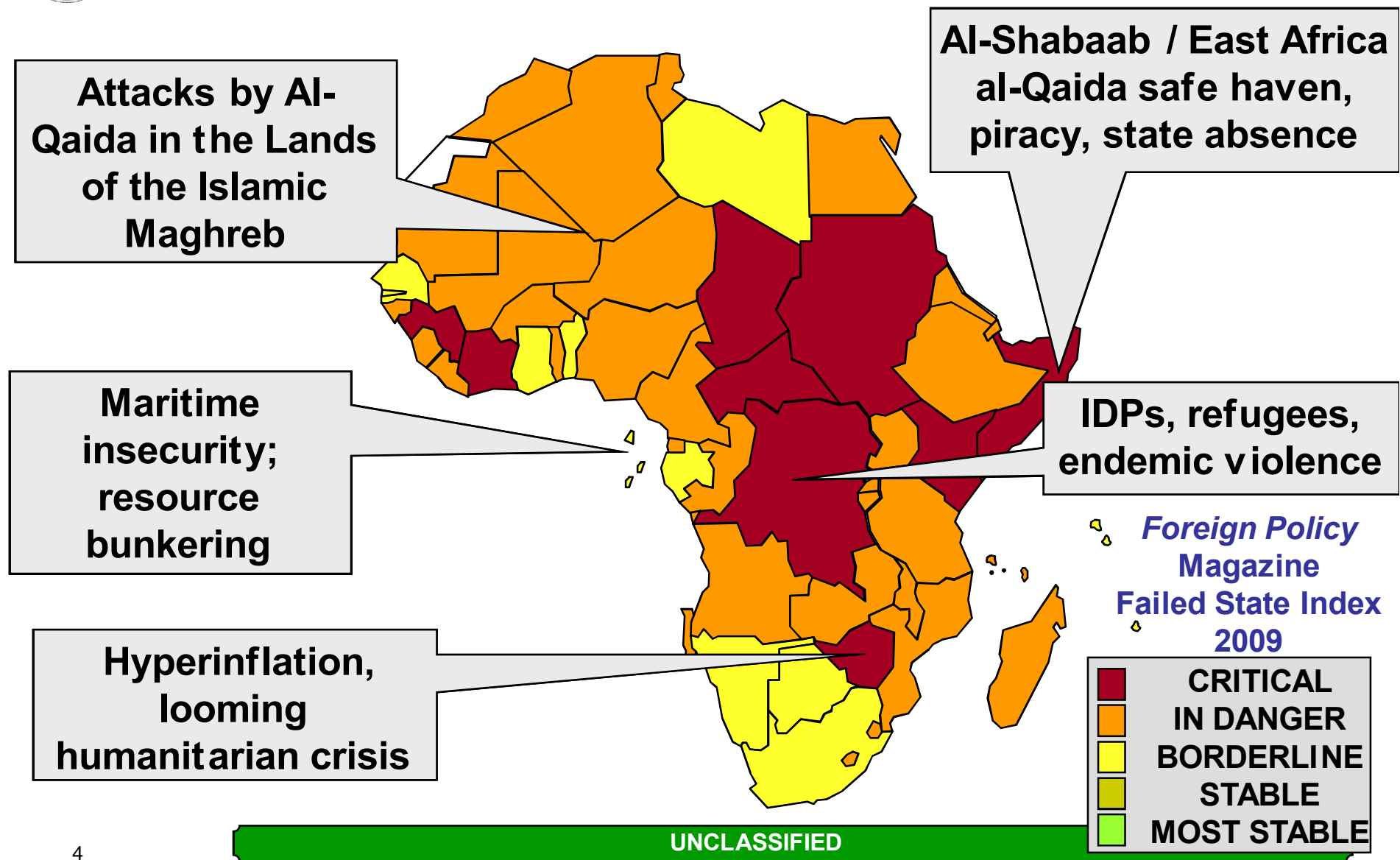


Simplifies coordination of DOD activities in Africa and facilitates cooperation with existing regional organizations

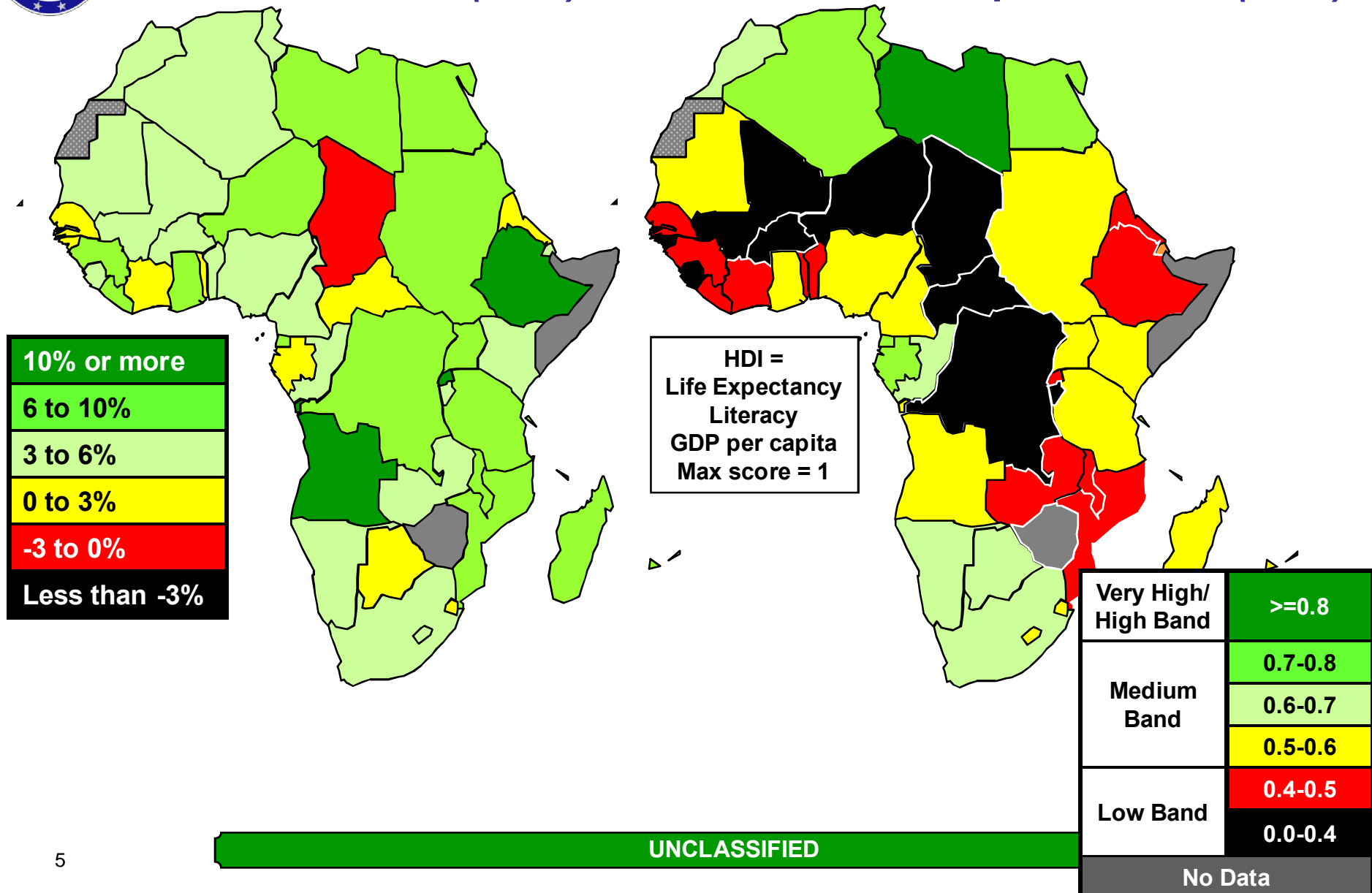

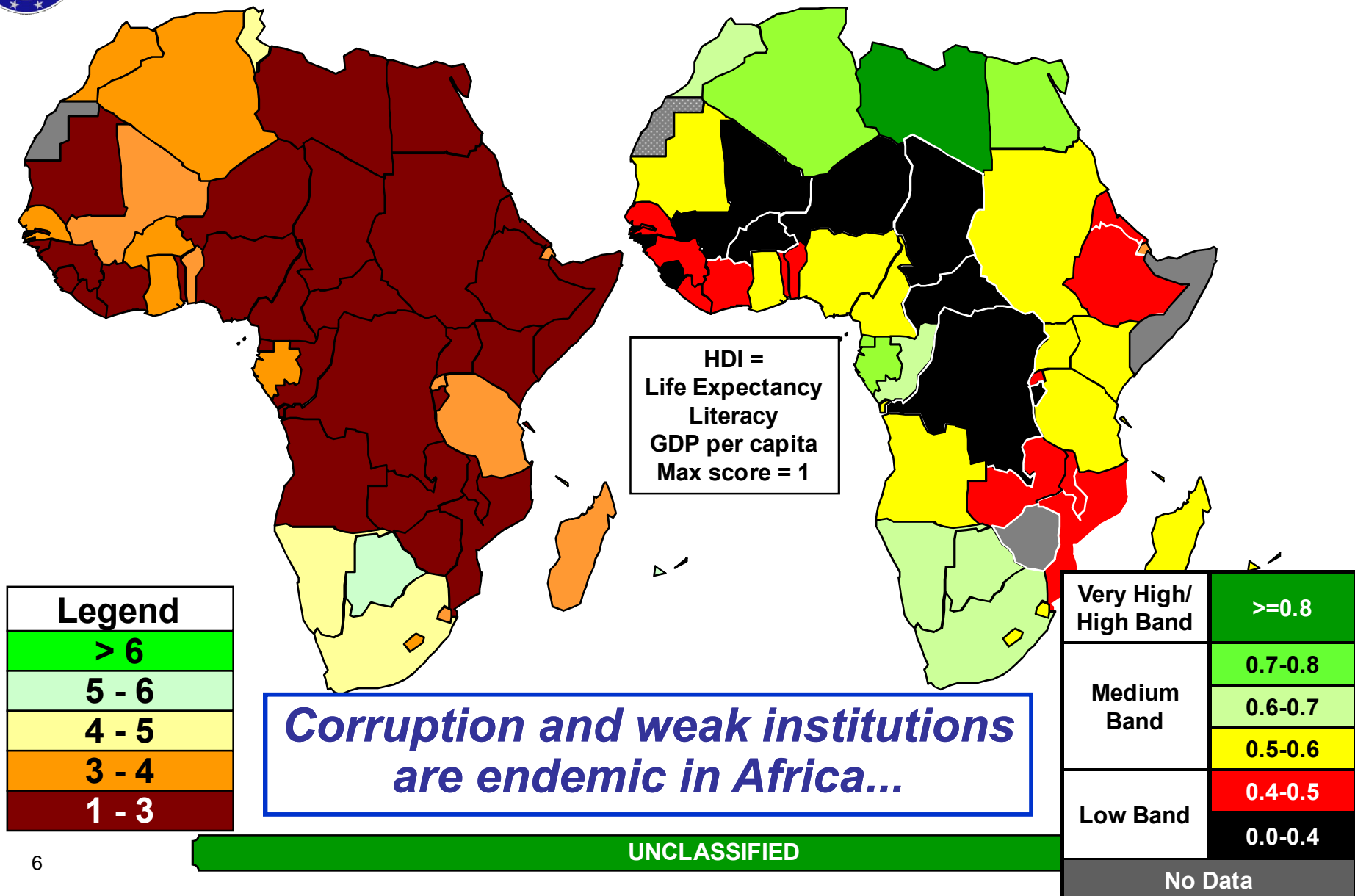
Africa's Greatest Challenge...

Real GDP Growth (2008) vs. UN Human Development Index (2009)





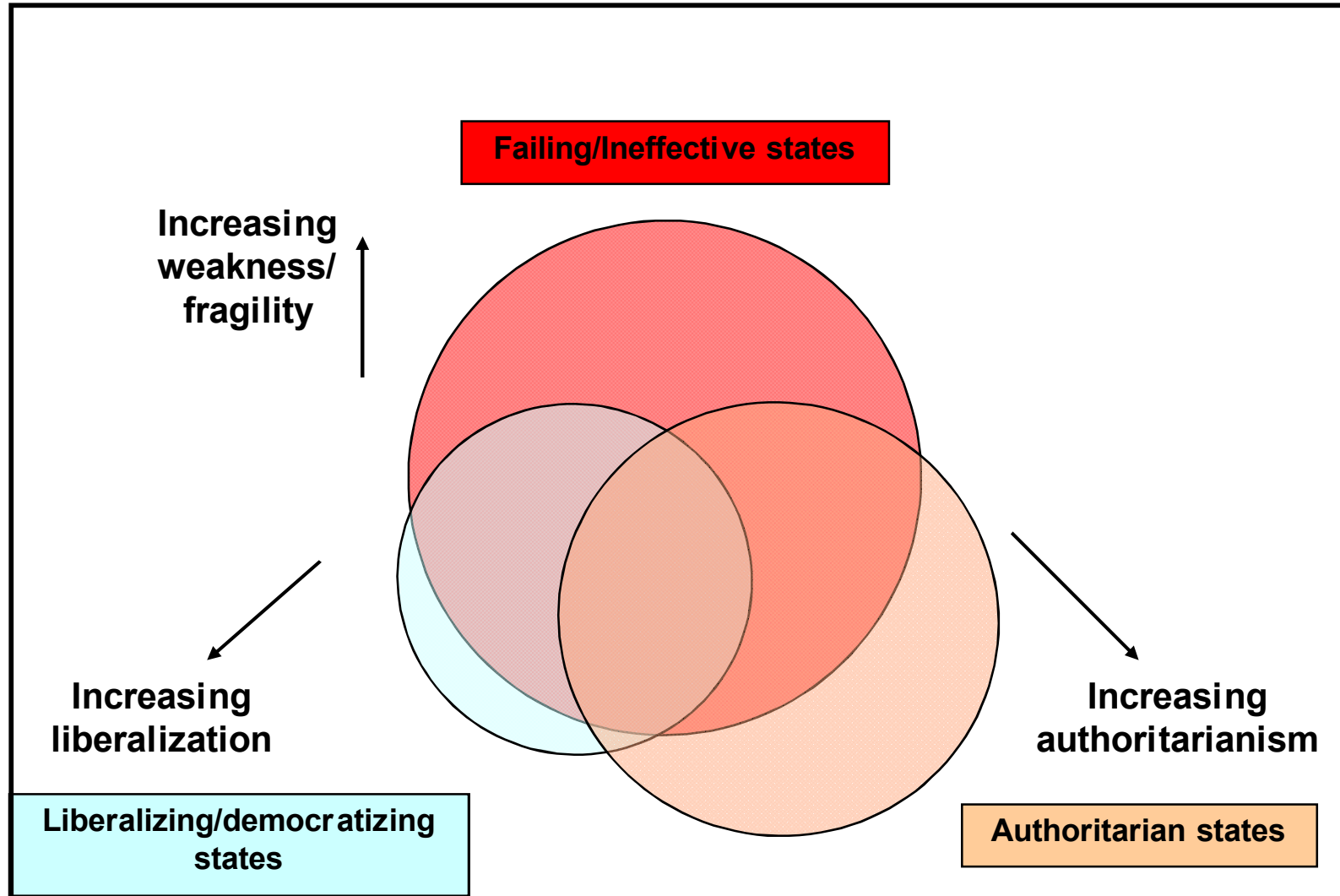

Africa's Political Landscape



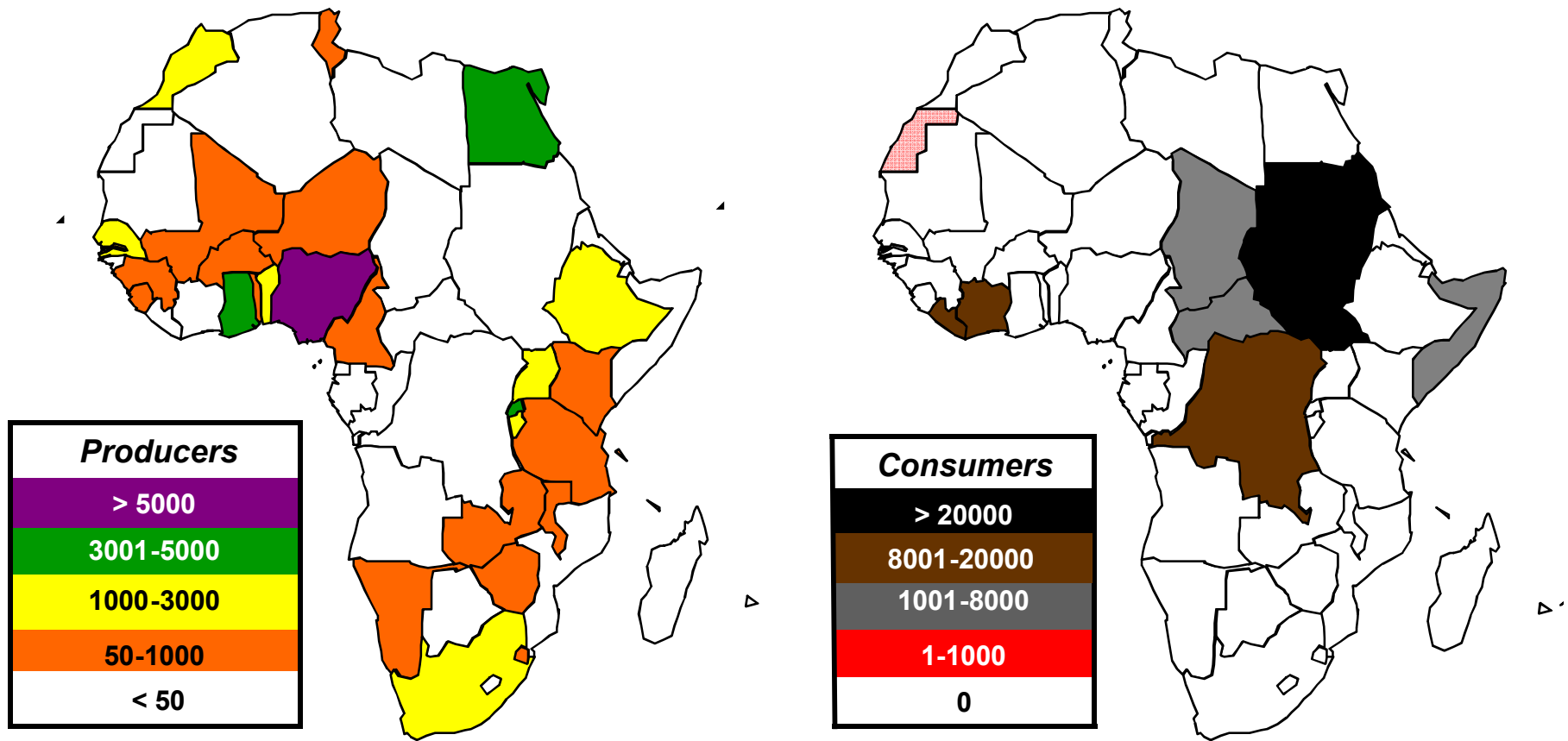

(1 of 2)

- “ AQN is defeated in AOR**
- “ U.S. and designated African states maintain assured access and freedom of movement throughout the AOR**
- “ The American population is protected from deadly contagions emanating from the AOR**

Theater Strategic Objectives

(2 of 2)

- “ Partners cooperate in the creation of an environment inhospitable to the unsanctioned possession and proliferation of WMD**
- “ Support to broader USG efforts improves security sector governance/increases stability**
- “ Continental peace operations are effectively meeting mission requirements; peace operations capacity exists to respond to emerging crises**



Major Focus Areas

- “ Building partner capacity**
 - “ peacekeeping, air/maritime domain security, counter-terrorism, counter-narcotics, counter-piracy, HIV/AIDS prevention**

- “ Professionalization of militaries**

- “ Improving defense institutions, centers of excellence**

- “ Information operations**

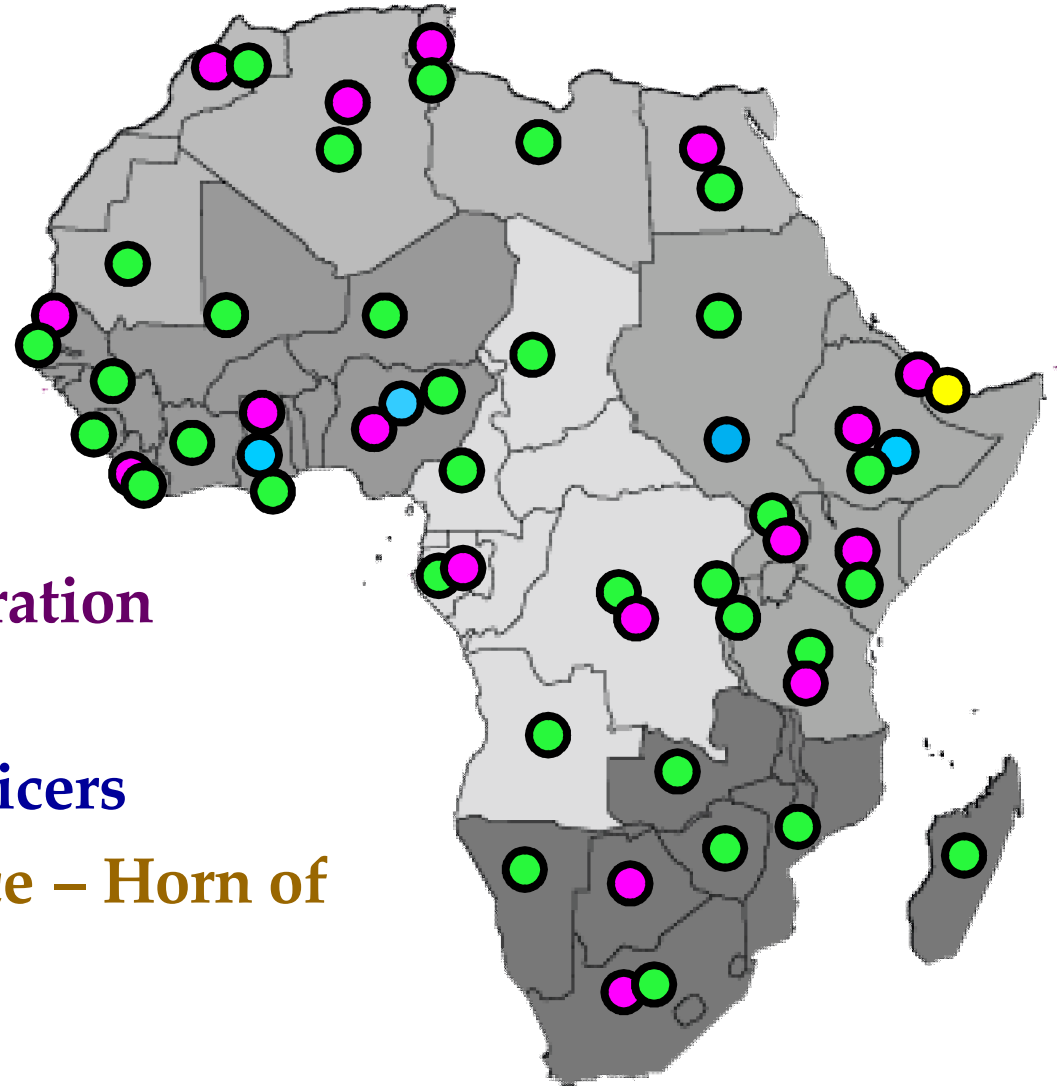
