Defense Budget Priorities and Choices: SOF References

- Europe & Global Partnerships ...the gradual drawdown of the post 9/11 wars will release more Special Operations Forces (SOF) capacity to partner in other regions
- Counter-terrorism Because we will continue to be engaged in counter terrorism operations around the globe, we protected key components of the force that are adept in executing this mission:
 - Special Operations Forces critical to U.S. and partner counter terrorism operations and a variety of other contemporary contingencies



SOF Acquisition Summit

- Among Combatant Commands, USSOCOM is unique in that it also has Service-like responsibilities to organize, train, and equip special operations forces
- Results in acquisition and budget activities that interact with those of the Services
- SOF Acquisition Summit is a relatively new forum that provides for dialogue at senior leadership level to better synchronize acquisition-related efforts among USSOCOM and Services
 - OSD attendees include AT&L, Comptroller, CAPE, Policy; J-8 also participates
- Although initially focused on acquisition, the Summit addresses many issues, disconnects
 - Requirements, acquisition, and resources are intertwined
 - Cannot discuss one without addressing others



Service/USSOCOM Budget Synchronization

- Recognition of the need for better synchronization between Service and USSOCOM budget submissions
- Budget & POM synchronization has been improved, but requires continued attention
- Up front communication between USSOCOM and Services avoids the need to address issues at OSD level later in the budget process



Service/USSOCOM Budget Synchronization

- SOCOM uses the IPL process to identify critical requirements that Services use to develop the POM
- Joint Staff Capability Gap Assessment (CGA) influences development of Defense Planning & Programming Guidance (DPPG) based on SOCOM IPL submissions
- Services, SOCOM discuss Service equities in IPLs
- SOCOM submits Service POM requirements
- Service deliberations assimilate SOCOM POM submissions into Service POM
- SOCOM participates in Program Budget Review by submitting Issue Papers against Service POMs
- SOCOM may submit Joint Urgent Operational Needs (JUON) for urgent or emerging requirements
 - JUON can result in immediate acquisition of available systems, rapid development of a new system, or a program of record if extensive R&D is required
