SUBJECT: Countering Improvised Explosive Devices

This Presidential Policy Directive reaffirms the 2007 Strategy for Combating Terrorist Use of explosives in the United States and provides guidance to update and give impetus to our Nation's ability to counter threats involving the use of improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and secure the United States and its allies, partners, and interests from attacks using IEDs and their consequences.

I. Background

As the 2011 National Strategy on Counterterrorism and the Strategy to Combat Transnational Organized Crime affirm, terrorists and transnational criminal organizations pose a fundamental, significant, and enduring threat to our Nation.

Over the past decade, the number and complexity of worldwide incidents involving IEDs has increased underscoring the enduring threat of IED attacks by terrorists and transnational criminal organizations and the asymmetric and adaptive nature of

Presidential Policy Directive (PPD) – 17 Countering Improvised Explosive Devices

- Signed June 14, 2012
- Establishes IED's as an enduring threat
- Expands 2007 strategy globally
- Calls for Development of Enduring U.S. C-IED capabilities

"It is the Policy of the United States to establish and implement measures to prevent, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate attacks against using IEDs and their consequences at home and abroad."

US Policy Statement on C-IED

- Signed February 26, 2013
- Calls for strengthening US Policy through improving integration of Federal, State, and Local C-IED assets
- Calls for improved ties between federal agencies to improve response to IED's
- Calls for a Whole of Government approach to Combat the Threat of IEDs

"The threat from IED use is likely to remain high in the coming decade and will continue to evolve in response to our abilities to counter them."

NDAA 11

EOD forces are indispensable combat enablers and contribute significantly to security, stability, counterinsurgency, and counterterrorism objectives

NDAA 12

The committee recognizes that the EOD force is a key enabler for combatant commanders and will continue to be vital for the foreseeable future.

NDAA 13

The committee recognizes that DoD has developed a uniquely trained and highly qualified Joint Service EOD community capable of rendering safe and mitigating IED threats, as well as considerable Counter-IED (C-IED) technologies and capabilities.

SUBJECT: Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA)

References: See Enclosure 1

1. PURPOSE. This Directive:

- a. Establishes policy and assigns responsibilities for DSCA, also referred to as civil support.
- b. Incorporates and cancels DoD Directive (DoDD) 3025.1 and DoDD 3025.15 (References (a) and (b)).
- c. Supplements the regulations (in DoDD 5525.5 (Reference (c))) required by section 375 of title 10, United States Code (U.S.C.), (Reference (d)) regarding military support for civilian law enforcement.
- d. Provides guidance for the execution and oversight of DSCA when requested by civil authorities or by qualifying entities and approved by the appropriate DoD official, or as directed by the President, within the United States, including the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and any territory or possession of the United States or any political subdivision thereof.
- e. Authorizes immediate response authority for providing DSCA, when requested.
- f. Authorizes emergency authority for the use of military force, under dire situations, as described in paragraph 4.1. above the signature of this Directive.

2. APPLICABILITY. This Directive:

- a. Applies to OSD, the Military Departments, the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other

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DoD Directive 3025.18

- Signed 21 September 2012
- Assigns SECDEF as the approval for all DoD support to civilian authorities
- Immediate Response Authority to save lives, prevent human suffering

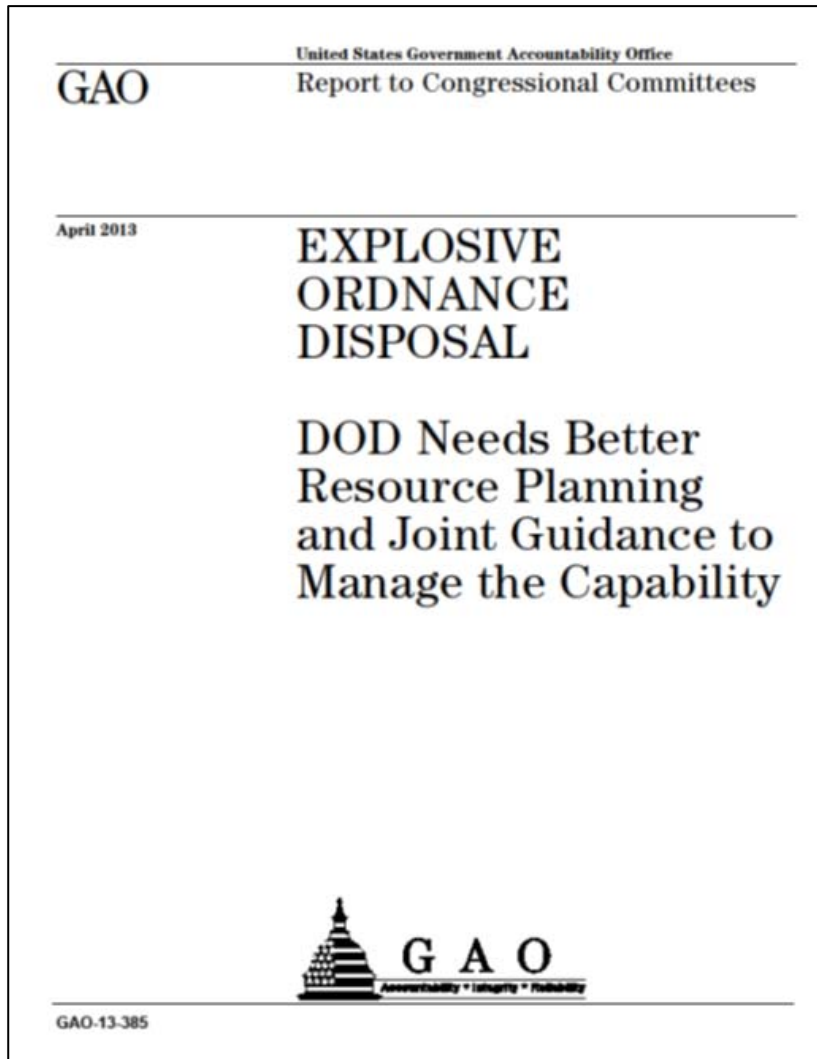
DoD Instruction 3025-21

- Signed 27 February 2013
- Supplements DoDD 3025.18
- Authority for off base EOD response
- EOD as an "Immediate Response"
- Establishes closest unit concept
- Assigns COCOM EOD requirements



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Closing the Gaps



Government Accounting Office (GAO) Report

- Published 24 April 2013
- Calls for the Services to provide data on costs to support EOD
- Recommends that the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs develop joint EOD doctrine

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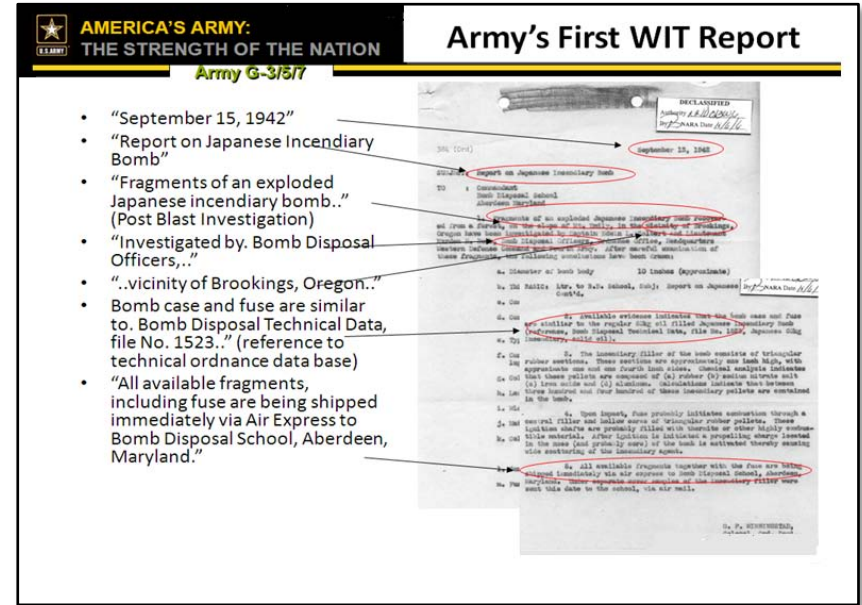

Support of Civil Authorities

Background

- ❑ DoD EOD has 60+ year History of Supporting Civil Authorities
- ❑ DoD EOD is the preeminent EOD Force in CONUS
- ❑ Strategic Documents call for increased Federal, State, and Local cooperation
- ❑ DoD Policies being updated to reflect current reality



Synopsis

- ❑ DoD always acts in a supporting role
- ❑ DoD responds when the threat exceeds other local, state, and federal assets
- ❑ DoD support primarily involves response to military munitions and explosives items
- ❑ DoD maintains the capability to provide full spectrum EOD support when requested

Legislative Environment

- ❑ The **Posse Comitatus Act** of 1878 prohibits DoD from exercising law enforcement powers within the US
- ❑ Robert T. **Stafford** Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act of 1988 requires Presidential approval for DoD assistance.
- ❑ DoD Directive 3025.18 provides guidance

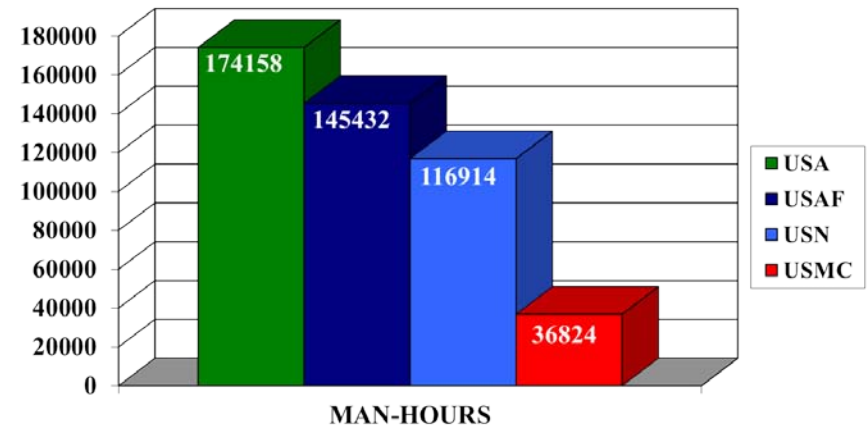
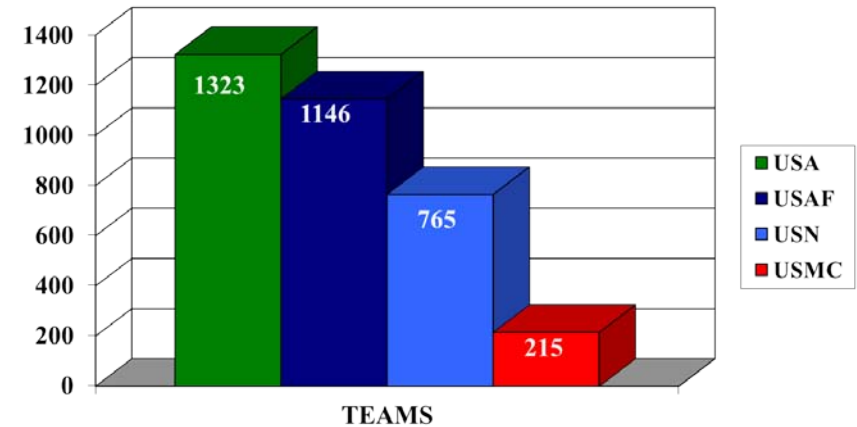

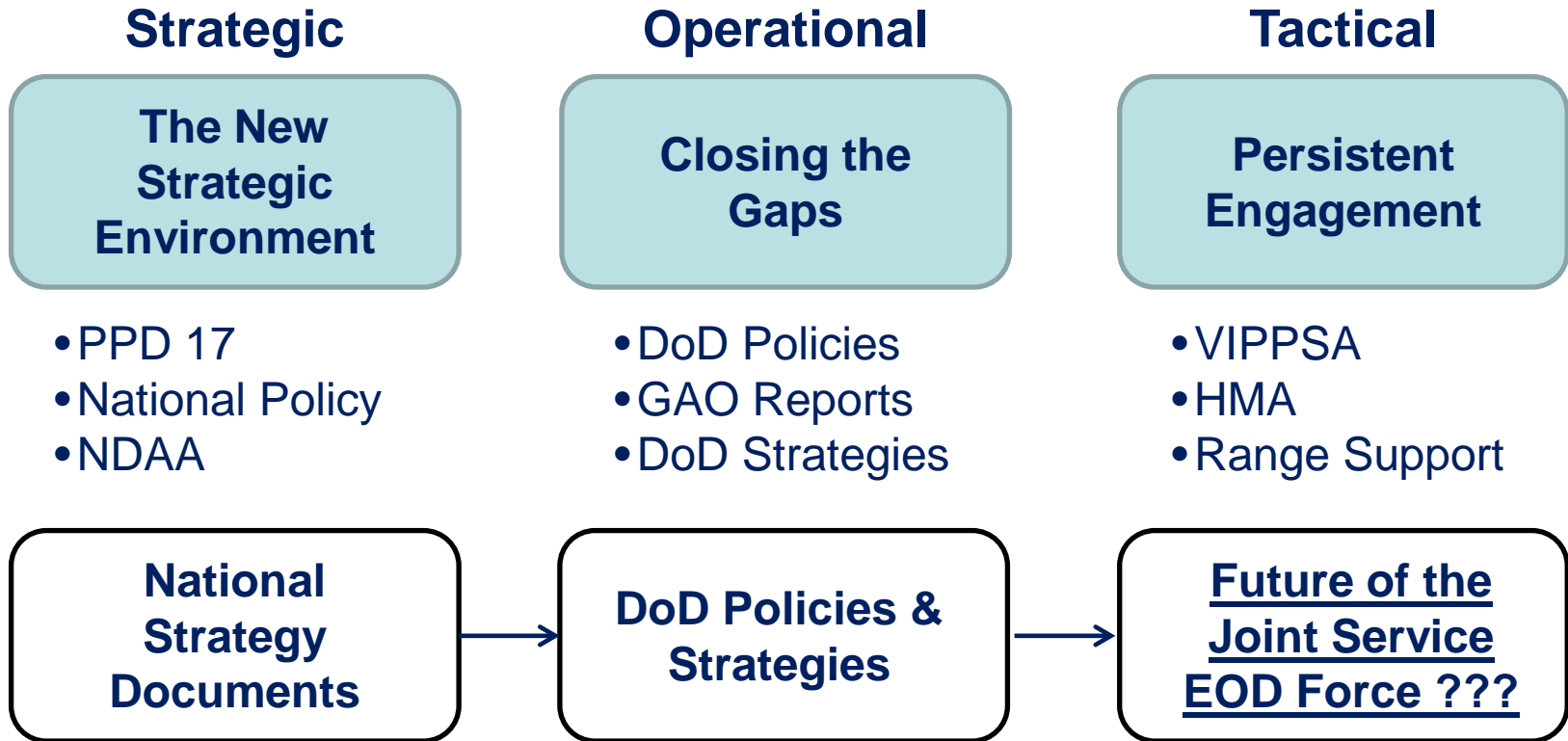
