## **DoD Non-Lethal Weapons (NLW) Program**



"Weapons, devices, and munitions that are explicitly designed and primarily employed to incapacitate targeted personnel or materiel immediately, while minimizing fatalities, permanent injury to personnel, and undesired damage to property in the target area or environment. NLW are intended to have reversible effects on personnel and materiel."

#### **DoD NLW Policy:\***

" ... expand the range of options available to commanders"

"Enhance the commander's ability to capture or incapacitate high value targets"

"The availability of NLW will not limit the commander's inherent right...to exercise unit self-defense"

"NLW may be used in conjunction with lethal weapon systems to enhance their effectiveness and efficiency in military operations..."



## **DoD NLW Program Organization**







## **Illustrative Technology Challenges**



- Advanced materials and payloads to non-lethally hail/warn, move, deny area, suppress, and temporarily disable individuals at ranges > 100 meters
- Directed energy technologies with reduced size, weight and cost for vehicle / vessel stopping
- Compact active denial technologies for non-lethal counter-personnel "push-back" or "repel" capabilities
- Clear-a-Space Technologies
- Human Electro-Muscular Incapacitation technologies to disable point targets or multiple targets (open and confined)
- Compact non-pyrotechnic flash-bang and "multi-bang" technologies
- Human Effects and NLW Weapon Effectiveness Studies, Risk Assessments, and Evaluations
