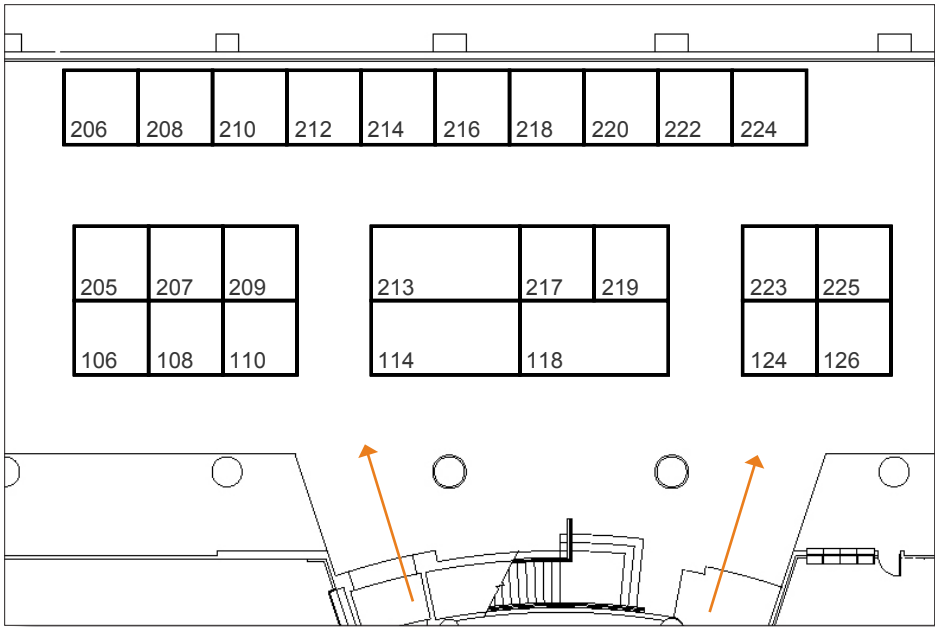

The impact of these transformative initiatives have had a profound cultural shift throughout

the enterprise that positions AMC to meet the needs of the warfighter with improved efficiency, better financial stability, and optimized supply chain capabilities.
