


Texas A&M System is Trusted with Classified Material




Dean Mark Welsh discusses new teaching site

A&M Corps of Cadets Graduates

- Served in every U.S. conflict from Spanish American War through Iraq and Afghanistan
- ➤ At least 264 became general and flag officers
- Nine earned four-star rank
- Seven awarded the Medal of Honor (Eight Aggies in all)
- More Aggies commissioned as U.S. Armed Forces officers than graduates from any other college besides the service academies.




The Texas Military Footprint and Economic Impact*
