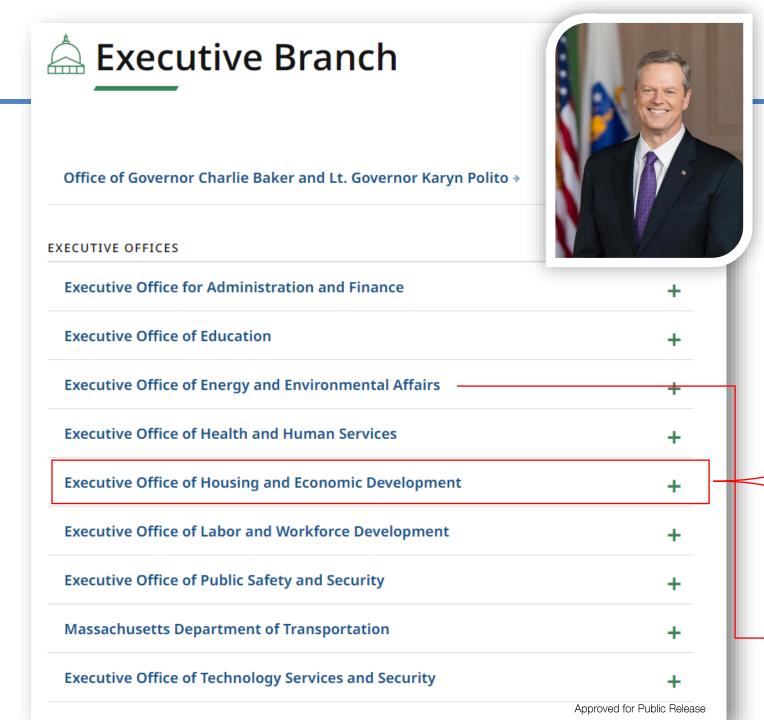

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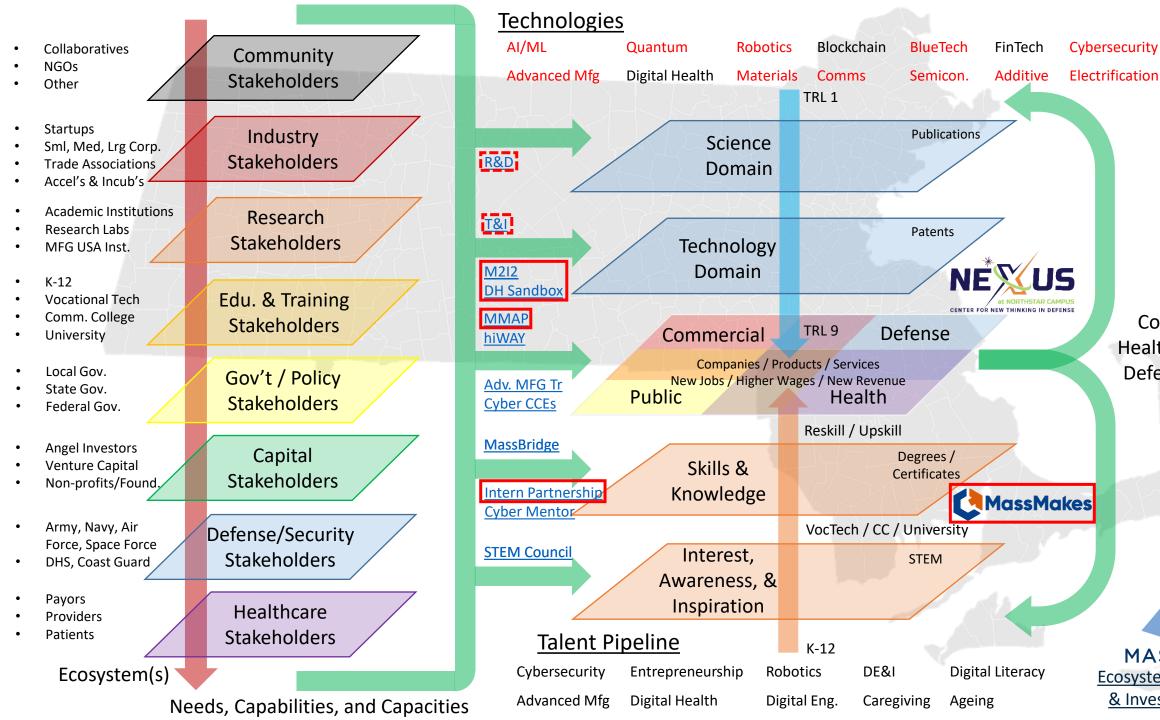
MA On the Move in Annual Defense Spending

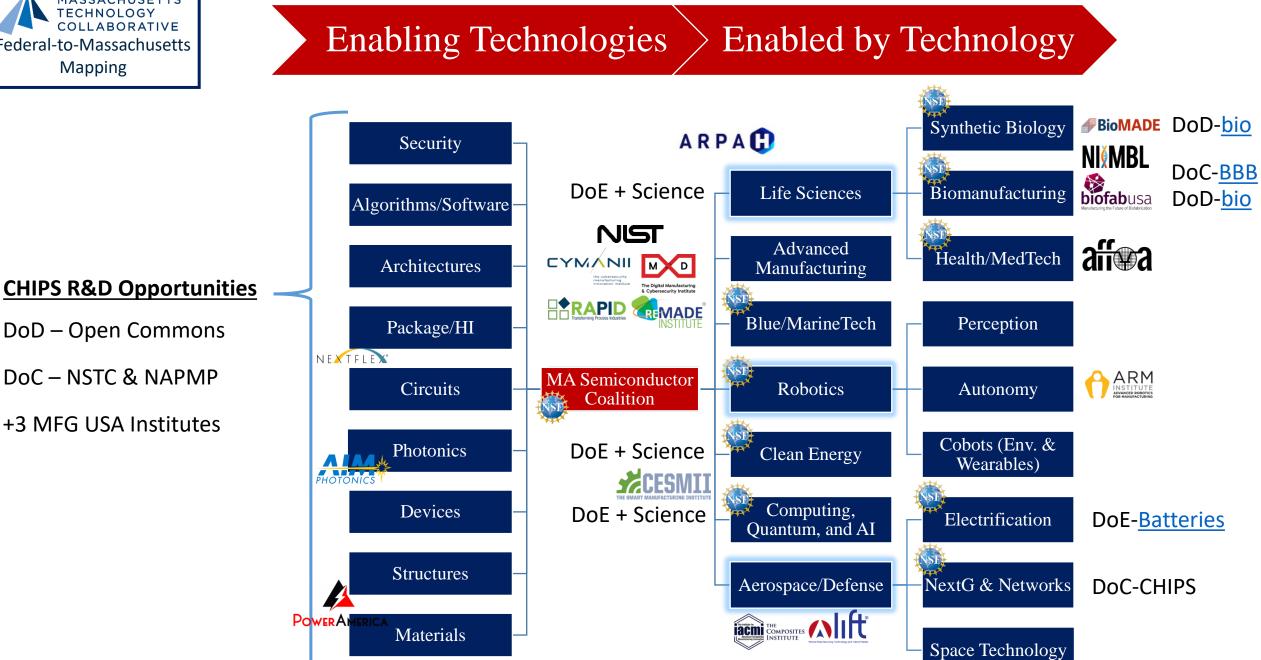
- Established with industry, academia, and government in May 2021 to prepare for CHIPS response
