

## HON CHRIS LOWMAN

*Assistant Secretary of Defense for Sustainment*  
Department of Defense

Senate-confirmed in May 2022, the Hon. Christopher Lowman, the former

senior official performing the duties of Under Secretary of the Army, took office as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Sustainment (ASD(S)) in June 2022.

As ASD(S), Mr. Lowman is the principal staff assistant and advisor to the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition & Sustainment (USD(A&S)), Deputy Secretary of Defense, and Secretary of Defense on DoD logistics, materiel readiness, and product support. On behalf of the USD(A&S), Mr. Lowman oversees the Defense Logistics Agency and

Defense Microelectronics Activity, and is the principal logistics official within senior DoD management.

He has served across the U.S. Army and the Joint Force for more than three decades.

From 2021-2022, Mr. Lowman served as the senior official performing the duties of Under Secretary of the Army. As the Secretary of the Army's senior civilian assistant and principal advisor on matters related to managing and operating the Army, he was also the Chief Management Officer of the Army and the Secretary's principal advisor on effective and efficient organization of business operations and transformation initiatives, the senior official for all Executive

and Senior Professional personnel actions, and responsible for supervising and directing all civilian senior leaders.

From 2018-2021, Mr. Lowman served as the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff (ADCS), G-3/5/7 (Tier 3), providing oversight and guidance to the Strategy, Plans and Policy; Cyber Operations; Administration and Resources; and Command and Control Support Agency Directorates. His focus included Planning, Programming, Budgeting and Execution of Deputy Chief of Staff, G-3/5/7 program and budget; cyber activities; special access programs; sensitive activities programs; and support to non-Army agencies.



## HON DAVID L. NORQUIST

*President & Chief Executive Officer*  
NDIA

The Hon. David L. Norquist is President and Chief Executive Officer of the National

Defense Industrial Association (NDIA). He joined NDIA on May 1, 2022 bringing with him more than 30 years of public and private sector experience in national security and federal financial management.

Mr. Norquist previously served as the 34th Deputy Secretary of Defense from 2019 to 2021 and was responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Department of Defense (DoD), including managing the Pentagon's budget and personnel. He led reforms in DoD business processes and realigned investments toward the challenges of multi-domain warfare. At the request of the Biden Administration, Mr. Norquist served as Acting Secretary of Defense and continued as

Deputy Secretary until the Senate confirmed Secretary Lloyd Austin and Deputy Secretary Kathleen Hicks.

From 2017 until 2019 as the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) and Chief Financial Officer, he supported the National Defense Strategy (NDS) through the development and execution of the DoD's annual budget of more than \$680 billion. Mr. Norquist strengthened accountability to the taxpayer by implementing DoD's first department-wide financial statement audit.

Mr. Norquist began his career in 1989 as a Presidential Management Fellow supporting Army intelligence as a program and budget analyst with assignments on the Army staff, a major command, a defense agency, and at an overseas field site.

Following his time with the Army, Mr. Norquist served for six years with the House Appropriations Subcommittee on

Defense as a professional staff member, where he focused on Air Force aircraft, munitions, ballistic missile defense and information assurance.

From 2002 to 2006, he served as a deputy undersecretary of defense in the Office of the Comptroller. In 2006, President George W. Bush selected him as the first Senate-confirmed Chief Financial Officer of the Department of Homeland Security.

Between his stints in government service, Mr. Norquist was a partner with Kearney and Company, a certified public accounting firm.

Mr. Norquist was born in Concord, MA. He is a 1989 graduate of the University of Michigan, where he received a BA in Political Science and a Master's in Public Policy. He also holds an MA in National Security Studies from Georgetown University.

### GEN GUSTAVE PERNA, USA (RET)

*Former Chief Operating Officer of the Federal COVID-19 Response for Vaccine and Therapeutics*

General Gustave Perna distinguished himself over the course of 40 years of exceptional service to the U.S. Government and the Department of Defense, culminating as Chief Operating Officer of the nation's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In this position, General Perna developed the strategy and oversaw the execution of the logistical support for the federal

government's distribution of the vaccines developed to help battle the COVID-19 pandemic. Prior to this, he served as the Chief Operating Officer of Operation Warp Speed, an effort to develop and produce an effective COVID-19 vaccine. General Perna's efforts were critical and highly effective in helping our nation through one of its most challenging times in modern history.

General Perna's vast logistics experience, relentless drive and highly effective leadership during this period, as well as throughout multiple other highly demanding assignments during his esteemed military career, has ensured a strong national defense and provided enduring benefits for our nation.

The Greer Award is presented annually to an industry individual in recognition of noteworthy contributions or meritorious service to the DoD in the area of integrated logistics support engineering and its implementation in maintenance and product support. The award was established in 1956 by Greer Hydraulics, Inc. to stimulate thought and develop programs which will benefit industry and the public. The award program encourages solutions to troublesome maintenance problems or to the development of integrated logistics support planning techniques to be employed in their solution. The award is presented in honor of its originator, Edward M. Greer.

### LTG RICHARD "DICK" FORMICA, USA (RET)

*Vice President, CALIBRE Systems*

In recognition of his meritorious service to the Department of Defense in the area of integrated logistics support engineering and its implementation in maintenance and product support, National Defense Industrial Association presents its 2022 Edward M. Greer Award to Lieutenant General Richard P. Formica, USA (Ret).

LTG General Richard P. Formica distinguished himself both on active duty in the Army and as Vice President of Strategic Initiatives for CALIBRE Systems, Inc. During his time at CALIBRE and in the Army he has helped

drive efforts to improve integrated logistics support for both the US and its allies. The most significant of these efforts were in the space and missile defense area supporting capability and material development for joint missile defense capabilities for US Strategic Command. He guided and approved several strategic documents including Space and Missile Defense Command's Campaign Support Plan; US STRATCOM's Global Integrated Air and Missile Defense (IAMD) Assessment; and the IAMD Global Force Management plan. He coordinated directly with US STRATCOM, US NORTHCOM, and

the geographic combatant commands for IAMD requirements, capabilities, capacity, and risk. Worked closely with the Joint Integrated Air and Missile Defense Organization, the Missile Defense Agency and the services in recommending IAMD input to the DOD program. His efforts were key to the development of material solutions and the logistics support behind them to provide the nation and our allies with an enduring missile defense program.

# GEN WILLIAM G. T. TUTTLE, JR., USA (RET) AWARD FOR BUSINESS ACUMEN IN DEFENSE AND GOVERNMENT

The GEN William G. T. Tuttle, Jr., USA (Ret) Award for Business Acumen in Defense and Government is an annual award established at the Institute for Defense and Business (IDB) in Chapel Hill, NC to recognize an exceptional business application in defense and government. The Tuttle Award is presented to an IDB Alum for demonstrating the best return on investment to his or her organization by successfully applying the lessons learned in an IDB education program. This year is the first year this award is presented at the National Logistics Forum.
