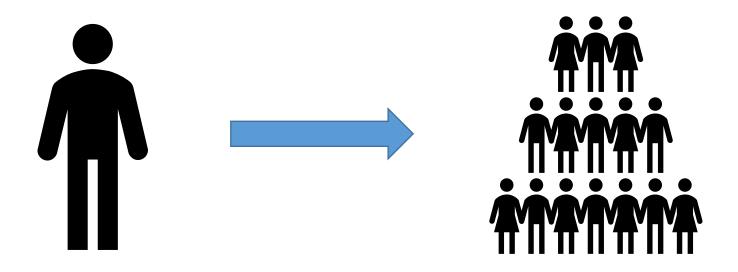

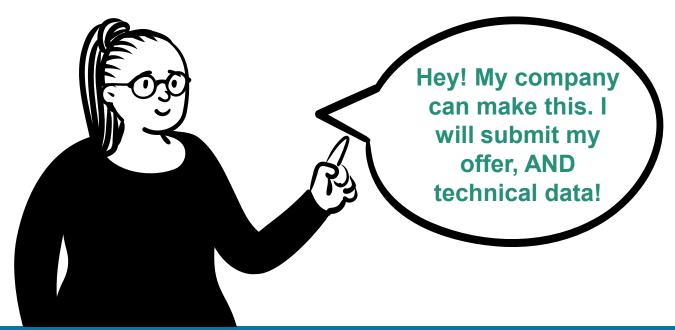
- Increasing competition for items that require an approved manufacturer
- Going from single source, or small number of sources, to multiple sources of supply







 Alternate Offer (AO) – An "Alternate Offer" is submitted for evaluation against an active solicitation in order for a company and their product information to be reviewed, potentially qualifying them as an "Approved Source" on current (and future) solicitations.







 Source Approval Request (SAR) – A Source Approval Request is a package of information provided by a prospective new supplier to become an approved source for procurement of an NSN. This package must contain all technical data needed to demonstrate competence to manufacture the NSN to the same, or better, level of quality than the current approved source(s) and can be submitted at any time.

Submission can be made at ANY time and does not require an active solicitation!





- Use the DLA SAR Guide
 - Guide includes detailed information about what needs to go into your package

- Acquisition Method Suffix Code (AMSC)
 - Must <u>not</u> be coded as "G" for full and open competition these don't require approval, just go ahead and bid!
 - Must <u>not</u> be coded as "T" these items are QPL and go through a different process.
 - Must be coded as "other than full and open competition," for example:
 - Source Controlled (AMSC B)
 - Source Restricted (AMSC C)
 - Code & Part Number (AMSC D)







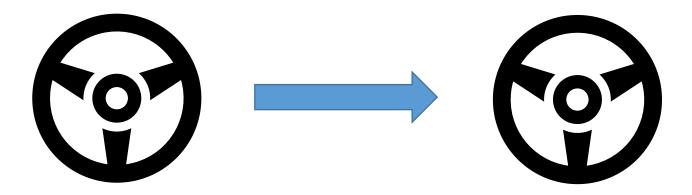
- Provide all required elements defined in the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Source Approval Request (SAR) and Alternate Offer (AO) Guide
- Acquisition Method Suffix Code (AMSC)
- Inclusion of the potential replacement product:
 - Estimated unit price
 - Quantity ranges (and if quantity influences price)
 - Clear identification of the actual manufacturer
 (Company Name, CAGE Code, Point of Contact, Manufacturing Site, etc.)







Category I – Actual Item: A company may submit a
 Category I package if they make the exact material, can
 prove this with thorough documentation, and the material has
 been provided to the government

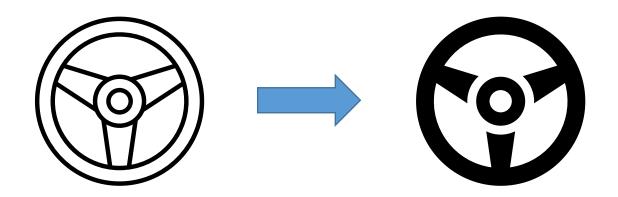


This category is for you if you have made the EXACT item before, to drawing specifications, and have provided the item to the government.





Category II - Similar Part: A company may submit a Category
II package if they make a similar part and can prove they have
the capability to make the exact part

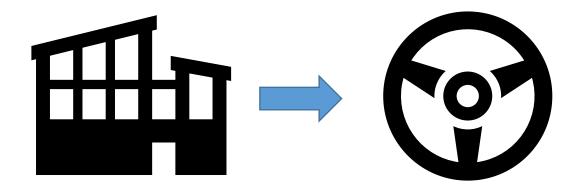


This category is for you if you haven't made the EXACT part and provided it to the government, but you have made something very similar in fit, form, function, and criticality – and provided those to the government.





 Category III - New Manufacturer: This category covers items that do not meet Category I or II criteria, but the company may have capabilities to make the exact part and can fully demonstrate those capabilities

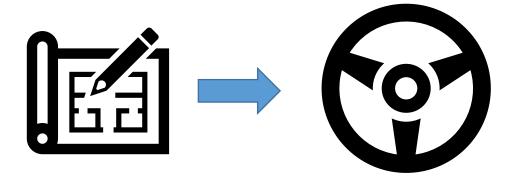


This category is for you if you have not made the exact item for the government, but you are a proven manufacturer and can demonstrate your capabilities to produce the exact item.





 Category IV – Reverse Engineered Part: Submissions for material under Category IV are submitting for source approval by means of reverse engineering (done at the expense – and risk – of the supplier)



This category is for you if you have reverse engineered an actual approved item that was procured through the government, and have done all required testing, inspection, etc., to build an entire technical data package, including drawings and manufacturing plan.





- Technical data must include:
 - Legible and complete copies of all drawings (signed and approved), specifications or other data necessary to clearly describe the characteristics and features of the product offered
 - Cover design, materials, performance, function, interchangeability, inspection and/or testing criteria and other characteristics
 - Required Certifications for Master Tooling, Technical Data Rights, etc.
 - Value Added
 - Reference DLAD Procurement Note L04 Offers for Part Numbered Items (SEP 2016)





• Format:

- Electronic copy via email, requested DoD Safe link, or CD
 - Please note, the preferred submission format is via email. If your package is too large for email, a DoD Safe link will be provided at your request.
- File size is limited to 8 MB for email, but is not limited on DoD Safe Submissions
- Cover letters should clearly identify the package as an Alternate Offer or SAR, along with other info outlined in Land and Maritime guidance
- Submit only one .pdf file for each NSN. No ZIP files.
- NO password protected files/CDs will be accepted
- Always retain copies. AO and SAR submissions will not be returned.





- Submission (with technical data)
 - Contracting Officer (KO)
 - AO must be submitted to the KO listed in all manual solicitations. The KO will forward for review
 - SAR Monitor, Competition Advocate Office (CAO)
 - AO for automated solicitation must be submitted to the CAO
 - SAR must be submitted directly to the SAR Monitor, CAO for review and evaluation
 - dsccao-sar@dla.mil

It is acceptable, and encouraged, to send your alternate offer to the Contracting Officer AND the SAR monitor address to ensure it is received.





Tracking/Administrative Review

- SAR Monitor will log in all submissions for tracking and notify contractor of receipt
- SAR Monitor will perform the initial review to include projected cost savings, coordinating with the KO (if applicable) and Product Specialist (PS) as needed
- Packages that appear to meet minimum requirements are forwarded to Value Engineering (VE) for further review







Evaluation Factors

- Package evaluation is based on some, or all, of the following factors:
 - Cost savings to the Government
 - Demand/Need of the warfighter
 - Lead time
 - Obsolescence with demands in next 2 years
 - Sole source breakout
 - -Other(s)







Process Overview

- VE analyst assesses if package is complete/meets requirements
- Complete packages for Critical/Weapon System items are forwarded to applicable Engineering Support Activities (ESA)
 - Additional technical data may be required to support evaluation. If parts are required for ESA technical evaluation, these will be requested in writing by the Service.
 - A site inspection of facilities may be required to evaluate requests by the Government





Process Overview

- Incomplete packages
 - If potential for rework, contractor is contacted for additional information
 - If information is not received or significant deficiencies exist, the package is rejected back to the SAR Monitor







Notification

Notification

- Once a decision is made, the manufacturer will receive a formal notification from the SAR/Alternate Offer Monitor
- If the AO/SAR package is approved, the manufacturer will receive written authorization to participate as an Approved Source for the specific NSN in future procurements
- If the AO/SAR package is rejected, the SAR monitor will provide reasons, and will answer any questions

*NOTE: Becoming an Approved Source only grants the opportunity to compete to supply the item - it does not guarantee future contracts or orders





- While awards are NOT guaranteed:
 - The Government reserves the right to make multiple awards if, after considering the additional administrative costs, it is in the Government's best interest to do so
 - If awards will be made to more than one source, the offer that represents the best value to the Government shall receive not less than 60% of the total requirement
 - Unless an offeror submits unit prices for other quantities, unit prices submitted for the total requirement will apply to any partial awards

In short, we will do our best to ensure you are given the opportunity to compete for items you are a newly approved source on – and will continue to support your effort.





- Award of Solicitations will not be delayed due to pending AO/SAR package evaluations. The only exception will be for non- critical/weapon system items when mission requirements allow, and there are no qualified sources quoting.
- The SAR program allows for submission at any time, whether an open solicitation has been published for the subject NSN, or not

Replenishment Parts Purchase or Borrow (RPPOB) Program

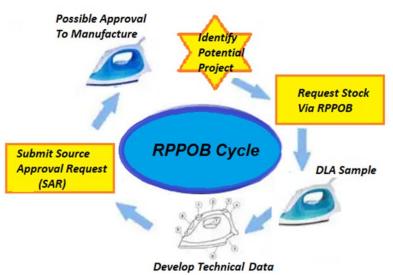

- The RPPOB program supports vendor initiated reverse engineering efforts
- Designed to allow vendors to visually inspect, borrow or purchase Government owned material with the intent of becoming an approved source







Statutory Requirement

- Defense Procurement Reform Act of 1984
- Public Law 98-525, Section 1216(a)
- Codified at Title 10 U.S.C. 2320(B)



Benefits

- Break Sole Source
- Provide additional sources on limited source items
- Reduce cost through enhanced competition
- Potential for Unlimited Rights Technical Data Packages (TDP)

GOAL: Enhance Competition





Direct Purchase

- Contractor purchases at Standard Unit Price (SUP)
- Item is <u>not returned</u>
- Specific terms spelled out in contract



Bailment

- Item loaned at SUP
- SUP held in Trust by DFAS
- SUP monies returned if item returned in original condition



View Parts or Send Pictures

- Contractors may inspect part in a designated area
- Test equipment not permitted







- Not eligible on Acquisition Method Suffix Codes (AMSC):
 - AMSC B (non-government source-controlled drawing)
 - AMSC G (full and open)
 - AMSC T (specification controlled)
- Not available on NSNs with less than \$10,000 annual buy value or with multiple years of stock on-hand
- Not to compare with other approved sources' stock
- Not to find out information on the NSN after being awarded a contract

Purpose: Develop New Sources in the best interest of the Government Reference - DoD Manual 4140.01, Volume 9





- Ensure vendor is **eligible** and item meets program requirements:
 - Verify Vendors are **not** suspended or debarred at time of request
 - Vendor is **not** already an approved source
 - Verify Joint Certification Program (JCP) certification
 - Item is not coded full and open, Annual Demand Value (ADV)
 \$10,000, stock available, etc.
 - Verify Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC)
 registration NSNs with Demilitarization Code other than "A
 or Q"

If you wish to proceed, you need to inform DLA





- Review data sources for releasable technical data
 - If no additional data is found (such as catalog data, picture, etc.) vendor is requested to <u>let us know if you want to proceed</u>
- If data is found, we will request whether you want to receive the data (cFolders) or continue to contact the Engineering Support Activity (ESA)
 - You will need to tell us if you want to proceed
- "ESA Concurrence" or "Own Risk" option is determined.
 - ESA Concurrence reverse engineering (RE) preapproval requested prior to bailment
 - Own Risk no pre-approval requested, and bailment can proceed





- 1st screening process
 - Maximum of 10 days
- 2nd screening process
 - Maximum of 10 days



- Request for ESA Concurrence
 - Minimum of 30 days for response from ESA
- Answer back to Vendor after ESA RE approval/denial
- Vendor provides monies VIA electronic payment and signs the agreement
- Item (when in Stock) sent to Vendor

Total Process has averaged a minimum of 1 Year

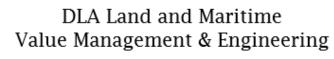




- List of NSNs available on Value Management Webpage
- Forecast information can be found on DIBBS webpage: Supplier Requirements Visibility Application (SRVA) link. It should provide 24 months of projected purchase order quantities
- Search the website to find opportunities that match your company's capabilities
 - Some available tools are:
 - PTACs (Procurement Technical Assistance Centers).
 - Haystack (available through your PTAC)
- Identify NSNs that are sole or limited-source
