recovery, as well as improved independent schedule risk assessment methods. He has experience serving in EVM leadership roles across the US Intelligence Community for over 20 years. He is a recipient of the 2021 Defense Acquisition Workforce Individual Achievement Award for EVM and the 2021 Intelligence Community Resource and Financial Management Excellence in Innovation Performance Management Award.

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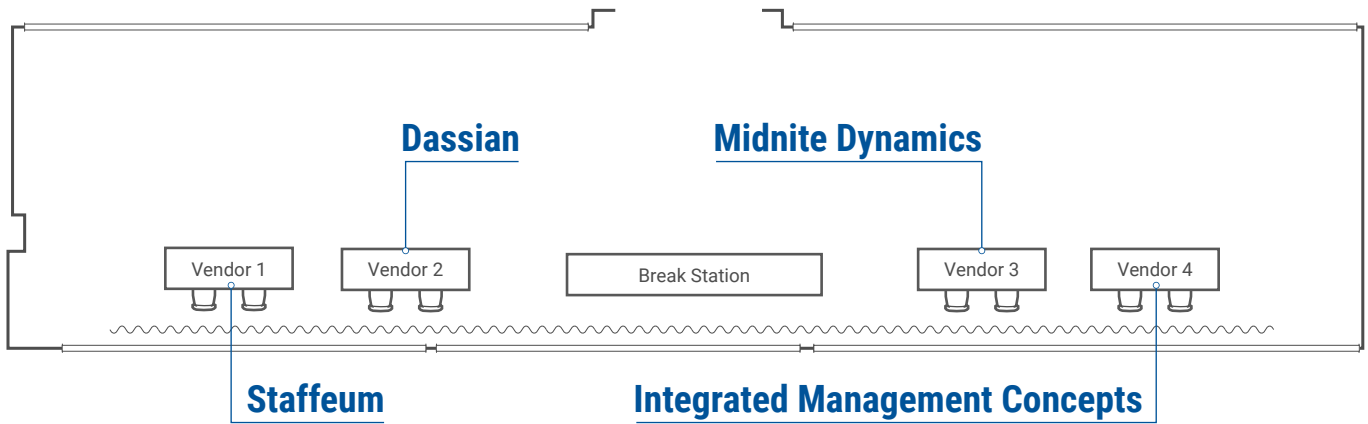

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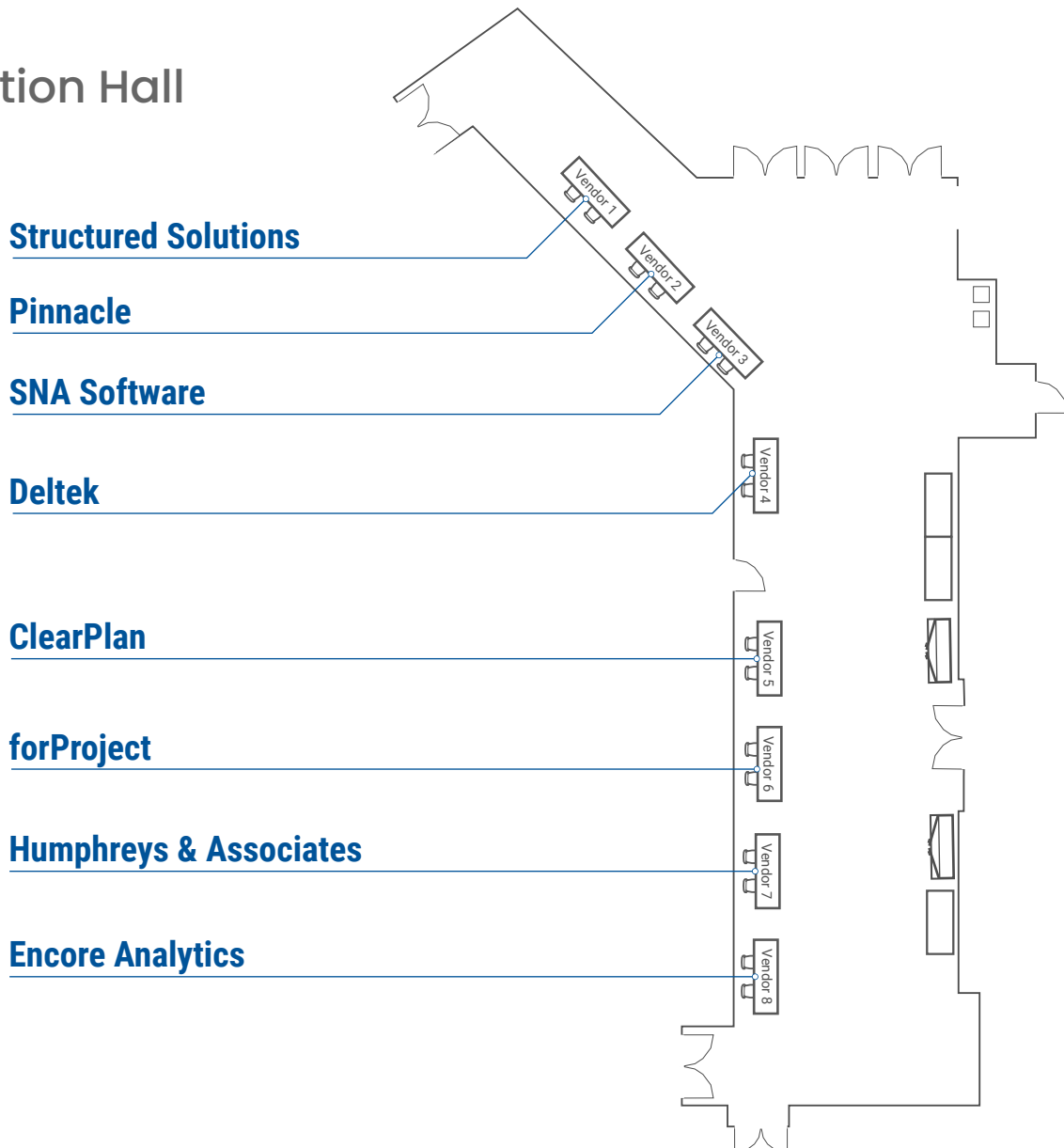

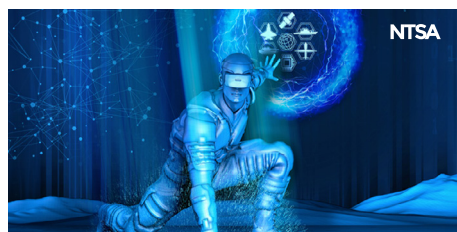
