VIRTUAL

The NDIA has a policy of strict compliance with federal and state antitrust laws. Maj Gen Abba earned his commission through the United States Air Force Academy in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science in Human Factors Engineering. He has held a variety of flying assignments at the squadron, group and wing level, including serving as the weapons officer for the 58th Fighter Squadron at Eglin Air Force Base, FL; director of operations for the 27th Fighter Squadron and commander of the 94th Fighter Squadron, both at Langley

AFB, Virginia; commander of the 3rd Operations Group at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska; and commander of the 53rd Wing, Eglin Air Force Base, FL. The general's staff assignments include Airpower Strategist in Project CHECKMATE, Assistant Executive Officer to the Air Force Chief of Staff, and Senior Air Force Strategy Advisor in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy. Prior to his current assignment, Maj Gen Abba was the Director of the F-35 Integration Office, Headquarters United States Air Force, the Pentagon, Arlington, VA.
