






Continuously modernize the Army, as part of the Joint Force, through rapid and timely delivery of Soldier capabilities that deter adversaries and win our nation's wars.



- (JCCL) Contested logistics: "logistics that occur under conditions wherein an **adversary** or competitor deliberately seeks or has sought to deny, disrupt, destroy, or defeat friendly force **logistics operations**, facilities, and activities across any of the **multiple domains**."
- (Title 10 of the U.S. Code (10 USC § 2926) Contested logistics environment: "an environment in which the armed forces engage in conflict with an adversary that presents challenges in all domains and directly targets logistics operations, facilities, and activities in the United States, abroad
- Logistics focuses on the right products being in the right place at the right time, and how to get them there.
- Supply chain management outlines the strategy and activities that go into planning, sourcing, producing and delivering goods, as well as handling returns

- Focus on acquisition program execution that ensures rapid delivery of equipment to the Army's Soldiers.
- Improve the Army's policies and practices regarding the acquisition of software.
- Return the Army to a focus on security in acquisition, with a special focus on cyber and supply chain security.
- Ensure realistic operational testing is integrated into Army programs, including rigorous cyber testing.
- Ensure the Army's modernization efforts are closely coordinated with Congress and other key stakeholders.
